Christmas Festival of Lights at the Zoo


Sunday, December 6th from 4:00 pm to 8:00 pm

The Samara United Methodist Church and the Volga District of Eruasia Central Conference, Russia – through our relationship with Samara UMC, we assist the church in achieving its vision of being a dynamic and growing church meeting the physical and spiritual needs of those living in their community.

The Henderson Settlement and Red Bird Mission, Kentucky -

both of these partners seek to meet the needs of those in poverty in



rural Appalachia, Kentucky. The Henderson Settlement seeks to provide for basic needs (education, housing, food, clothing, jobs, etc) through God's love. The Red Bird Mission School has

educated and shaped the faith of children from families of coal miners and loggers from three different counties.
