A NOTE FROM PASTORS CATHY & DOUG JOHNS

Generations of Faithfulness. What comes to your mind when you read this phrase? A rich history of scores of church members dedicating themselves to ministry larger than themselves? Generations of families finding a place to belong and become when touched by the love of Christ? Generations of Faithfulness was chosen as the theme of the Capital Stewardship Campaign for several reasons. The reference to Psalm 145 “rings” in our hearts today as it has in generations before us and will for generations to come.

“One generation shall commend your works to another, and shall declare your mighty acts.”
(Psalm 145:4)

WHAT DID WE INHERIT?

We stand on the shoulders of faithful generations who generously gave of themselves and their resources to provide what we enjoy today:

- 1927** A spectacular sanctuary stands here with beautiful gothic architecture. Countless lives have been changed by finding God in this beautiful space.
- 1952** A 25-year anniversary stewardship campaign was held to burn the mortgage. Many people stepped out in faith by mortgaging their homes during the depression to help pay the Church’s mortgage
- 1963** An educational wing was built to create space for children, youth, and adults to deepen their relationship with God.
- 2000** Redesigned the chancel to facilitate worship and a new entrance
- 2007** Welcome center to create space for community.

HOW WILL WE STEP OUT IN FAITH FOR THE NEXT GENERATION?...



2019 MARKS A CROSSROADS FOR HOW WE WILL FAITHFULLY AND GENEROUSLY PROVIDE FOR THE FUTURE.

We have the opportunity to provide future generations with facilities for effective ministry. How will this Connection Center become the hub of ministry and mission and help change lives? The Connection Center, Family Center and renovated space will...

- Provide a clear and direct path for newcomers to worship and community spaces
- Welcome our neighbors with a comfortable, open, inviting space that includes an Internet café, an indoor playground, and comfortable seating.
- Facilitate relationships in a space where people can find new friends and discover a new purpose for living
- Serve multiple generations. The Family Center will provide a safe dedicated space for children and family ministry.
- Include major repairs for addressing drainage issues in the refectory, water damage to walls and floors, and replacement of historic windows.
- Renovate the kitchen, updating the refectory to become more attractive and hospitable, and modernize spaces to accommodate our overnight guests (Interfaith Hospitality Network and Summer Impact participants)

The proposed upgrades and additions align our current mission and ministry with the original stated policy for the facilities at the corner of Observatory and Grace. This policy hangs in the sanctuary narthex and is reprinted inside this newsletter and is why we are called “Community” United Methodist.

The following, stated in the dedication worship materials from the fall of 1927, still challenges us today:

“This edifice represents a faith built in stone; the faith that all sorts and conditions of people can unite in the worship of God; the faith that such worship must find its fitting expression in work for the bettering of the community and the inbringing of the Kingdom. May the experience of the coming years prove the justification of this faith!” (From the Program of Dedicatory Services, September 25 to October 9, 1927)

This statement expresses the past, present, and future faith of Hyde Park Community United Methodist Church. Through the use of brick and mortar we again have the opportunity to move Hyde Park Community United Methodist Church to the origins of our calling: a calling to all who mourn and need comfort, to all who are tired and need rest, to all who are friendless and want friendship, to all who are lonely and want companionship, to all who are homeless and want sheltering love. *A great tradition has been passed down to us by the courageous leaders whose vision made possible our progress and growth in the past. What is your vision for the future of God’s work at the corner of Grace and Observatory? How will we join the Generations of Faithful who have walked this path before us to pass on this vision to future generations? They had it right in 1927 and we can continue this faithfulness for generations to come.*

OUR OFFICIAL POLICY

*Adopted in April 1926,
displayed on a plaque in the Narthex today*

“The determined policy of this Church is that it shall be a seven-day-in-the-week Community Church. Just so far as physically possible it will be thrown open for the use of all community gatherings, community interests, community programs.”

Research shows that guests know within the first 7 minutes of contact whether they feel comfortable enough to return.

They decide on the basis of:

- Simplicity of arrival experience and wayfinding within the space
- Sense of approachability and welcome in facility
- Visible Commitment to Growing Children and Youth

These characteristics are **CENTRAL** to our mission to **MAKE DISCIPLES** as a 7-day-a-week Community Church. How do we embrace this calling in our community today? How do we recognize the faithfulness of past generations and move forward for new generations


