Love is...what overcomes everything

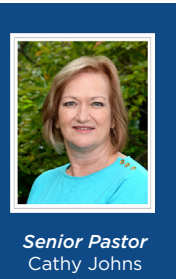

PASTOR SHERMAN BRADLEY

Sherman is the one of the pastors at The Warehouse, our second campus in OTR. Sherman and Sadell (co-pastor and wife) have a vision to establish a multi-ethnic, inter-generational, and multi-class congregation in OTR. He is founder of Consider The Poor, LLC (CTP) a consulting, advocacy, training and service company focused on breaking the cycle of poverty, and helping the middle and upper classes better grasp how they can better assist those in poverty. Sherman served for ten years as Director of the Exodus Program for formerly incarcerated and addicted men, and subsequently as the Vice President of City Gospel Mission, Cincinnati's oldest homeless shelter. Sherman also trains on implicit bias and racial reconciliation through GoodFit.training. He also is the Co-Chair of Mosaix Cincinnati, a consortium of pastors who have a passion for seeing multi-ethnic churches flourish in the Region. Sherman is an honorably discharged US Air Force Veteran. He is the father of Whitney, Shaniqua and Robert, and the grandfather of Jaxon and Robert, Jr., with another grandson on the way. We welcome Sherman as a part of the Pastoral team at HPCUMC.
