The Ripple Effect: Purpose

Mark 10: 32-45

They were on the road, going up to Jerusalem, and Jesus was walking ahead of them; they were amazed, and those who followed were afraid. He took the twelve aside again and began to tell them what was to happen to him, saying, "See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be handed over to the chief priests and the scribes, and they will condemn him to death; then they will hand him over to the Gentiles; they will mock him, and spit upon him, and flog him, and kill him; and after three days he will rise again."

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." And he said to them, "What is it you want me to do for you?" And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" They replied, "We are able." Then Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared."

When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, "You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many."

Thank you for joining us for worship today. Please read and familiarize yourself with the following guidelines as we strive to keep you safe and continue in-person worship.

General:

- Masks will be required at all times
- No gathering before or after service.
- No more than 100 persons per service.
- Social safe distancing will be observed at all times.
- Free-standing hand sanitizing stations will be placed at each entrance.

Worship looks a little different:

- Hymnals, Bibles, and items in the Hymnal Racks will be removed from the pews (words to hymns will be projected on the screens).
- Friendship pads will not be passed.
- Offering plates will be placed at the entrances and base of the chancel (no passing plate).
- Communion will be offered with self-contained, individual cup/wafer.

What we need you to do to help:

- Worshipers will sign in prior to entering the sanctuary.
- We encouraged you to bring your personal hymnal and Bible.
- No "passing of the peace".
- Only worship leaders may sing.
- One-way directional traffic will be observed (entering from the south, exiting on the north) with the exception of persons with special needs
- Worshippers must sit in pews designated by worship time (9:30 or 11:00).
- Individuals may bring their own coffee with lids into the sanctuary; coffee fellowship will not be offered.
- Persons with a cold, flu-like symptoms and/or fever greater than 100 degrees should stay home and worship online.

If you Test positive for COVID-19 call the church office and talk with one of the pastors.

Things we are doing to keep everyone safe:

- Ushers will wear masks, greet and seat people, pass out masks, and exit persons safely.
- Bulletins will be laid out for individuals to pick up if desired.
- Screens will be used to assist/guide worship.
- Until further notice all pew cushions will be removed.
- Nursery and Sunday School will not be offered
- Nursery and Children's Sunday school is indefinitely suspended.

Thank you for your patience and perseverance as we navigated the COVID-19 waters, and continue to find our way to the new "normal." Stay healthy, safe and blessed!
