Justice Ministry Update - January 2021

Happy New Year from the Justice Ministry of Hyde Park Community United Methodist Church! As we look forward to a brighter year in 2021 we'd like to bring your attention to a couple of opportunities to engage for justice this month.

The Metropolitan Area Religious Coalition of Cincinnati (MARCC)

Here is an opportunity to take some tangible action. Cincinnati Action for Housing Now, a collaborative effort between MARCC, the Affordable Housing Advocates, and the Homeless Coalition, is still going strong on its ballot initiative to dedicate \$50 million each year into a citywide housing trust fund. After attending nearly 100 community events since initiating the petitioning cycle in June, the campaign now has 6200 signatures and will continue collecting signatures through February. MARCC has received a small grant to support a paid petition collector, and this person canvassed at various congregation-sponsored food and toy drive events through the holiday season.

The affordable housing crisis is the leading cause of homelessness. Show your support for this campaign! During January, one can sign the petition at the Homeless Coalition office, 117 E 12th Street in Over-the-Rhine. You can also follow the campaign on Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter although a quick check of Facebook at this writing shows information has yet to be updated since the holidays.

The League is recognized as the oldest and largest community-based organization devoted to empowering African American individuals and families. It is currently focused on workforce development, training, youth and financial services.
