DID YOU KNOW?

New Life Furniture Bank is Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky's ONLY "furniture bank" which partners with nearly 50 social service agencies giving direct supportive services to individuals transitioning back into permanent housing. These agencies depend on NLFB to provide basic, essential home furnishings to families who would otherwise be moving into a completely vacant home. As of August 1, NLFB has fully furnished 744 homes and estimates more than doubling that number by the end of the year. Donations of gently used furnishings are critically needed to meet the overwhelming need in our community.
